- Ans The three components of a map are—
distance, direction and symbol.
- (b) What are the four cardinal directions?
- Ans North, South, East, and West.
- (c) What do you mean by the term 'the scale of a map'?
- Ans → The scale of the map is defined as the ratio between the distance on the land to the distance on the map.
- (d) How are maps more helpful than a globe?
- Ans → Maps provide more information than a globe. A globe can be useful if we want to study the earth as a whole.
But when we want to study only a part of the earth, as about a country or a state, globe is of little help.
In such a situation only maps are useful.
